

# Water Efficient Demonstration Garden



Tualatin Valley Water District's two acre **Water Efficient Demonstration Garden** is an educational tool to promote efficient use of water in the landscape. The design team included local "green experts," a former District commissioner, and the District's Conservation Committee. The Demonstration Garden is a successful way to learn the seven basic principles of water-wise landscaping and also provides beautiful and water-wise landscape ideas.

You can tour the garden to view landscape ideas and groupings that anyone can apply to their landscape. Water use zones were created according to water demand. The Demonstration Garden is a certified Wildlife habitat and features "naturescaping" principles and ideas.

Each area has signage explaining the landscape material and irrigation methods used, and reasons why each area was planted or designed in that way.
